## Current Team Member FAQ's

### TODAY'S TOP 3 - April 24, 2020

1. New screening protocols will require employees entering our hospitals to “self-screen” before entry with the following questions:

- o Are you currently experiencing symptoms of an upper respiratory infection? (productive cough, shortness of breath, fever, sore throat)
- o Lost your sense of taste or smell
- o In the last 14 days, have you had contact with someone with confirmed or suspected of COVID-19, or a person that is exhibiting signs of respiratory illness?
- o Experiencing generalized symptoms such as achiness, headache, fatigue, with or without vomiting/diarrhea?
  - If you answer yes to generalized symptoms, please follow up with occupational health. Call 795-2830 during normal business hours, or 577-6494 after hours. If you answer yes to 2-3 screening results, you should report to the ED tent to be screened. If you have lost your sense of taste or smell, you should report to the ED tent to be screened prior to reporting for your shift. If you answer yes to only one of the screening questions, or are currently not having any symptoms, you should report to work and follow up with

occupational health. Temperature screening will continue.

**2. We are starting to plan for the eventual reopening of surgical services and procedures.**

Decisions of timing and what types of procedures will be scheduled are multifactorial, but we are aiming a return to selected, same-day, outpatient procedures for early May. We will not be notifying patients until these procedures can be safely rescheduled, without undue risk to either patients or staff.
