



COVID-19 Vaccination Update

A message to all CMH team members from John Alexander, MD, MHCM, FACEP, Chief Medical Officer, CMH

Incredible! Our amazing hero volunteers and team members vaccinated more than 300 frontline team members over 10 hours today. To date, we have administered the COVID-19 vaccine to 538 team members. Kudos to the team members and hero volunteers who are working so hard to protect our colleagues, our patients and their families!

Looking ahead, we are scheduled to receive 600 doses of the Moderna vaccine in the coming week, pending Emergency Use Authorization from the Food and Drug Administration. We will also be rolling out Phase 2 of our vaccine administration plan, which will include most team members who provide hospital-based services.

It is asking a lot, but please be patient to receive an email invitation to register for an immunization “class,” and only register to receive an immunization if you have directly received an email. The team working behind the scenes to roll out the vaccination clinic is working hard to make sure we get everything scheduled correctly, and there is quite a bit of regulatory documentation that goes into this process.

I can't say enough about the hero volunteers who are registering, administering, observing, and organizing at our clinics! They are all doing such an amazing job, and doing it with such joyfulness.
