- 1. Today, the first three members of a federal COVID-19 response team arrived at Central Maine Medical Center. The other four clinicians are expected tomorrow. They will be supporting vaccination efforts for our communities.
- 2. Lewiston Mayor Carl Sheline held a **press conference** to proclaim today "Get Fully Vaccinated, Get Your Booster and Wear a Mask Awareness Day." Central Maine Healthcare, St. Mary's Health System, AK Health and Social Services, the LA Metropolitan Chamber and other city officials joined him in urging people to take precautions to keep the community safe. Mayor Sheline highlighted the role of hospitals and healthcare workers in Lewiston in his remarks and his proclamation, which you can read **here**.
