## **TODAY'S UPDATE**

- 1. **ANTIGEN TESTING OF PATIENTS**: Today we approved policy on antigen testing which will be rolled out on Monday. It addresses, among other issues:
  - When antigen testing is preferable to PCR testing;
  - How to proceed with patients who screen positive with a PCR test prior to a procedure;
  - When to utilize a test-based strategy to discontinue precautions for severely ill or immunocompromised patients who may be infectious 20 days or longer; and
  - Precautions recommended for patients awaiting antigen test results.
- 2. **N-95 USE IN EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS**: N-95s will no longer be mandatory for team members in all areas of the EDs. N-95s continue to be required in the EDs when:
  - Working in triage;
  - Collecting COVID specimens;
  - Caring for patients who are COVID positive or are suspected of having COVID;
  - Around patients who cannot mask or do not reliably mask; or
  - Participating in aerosol-generating procedures.
